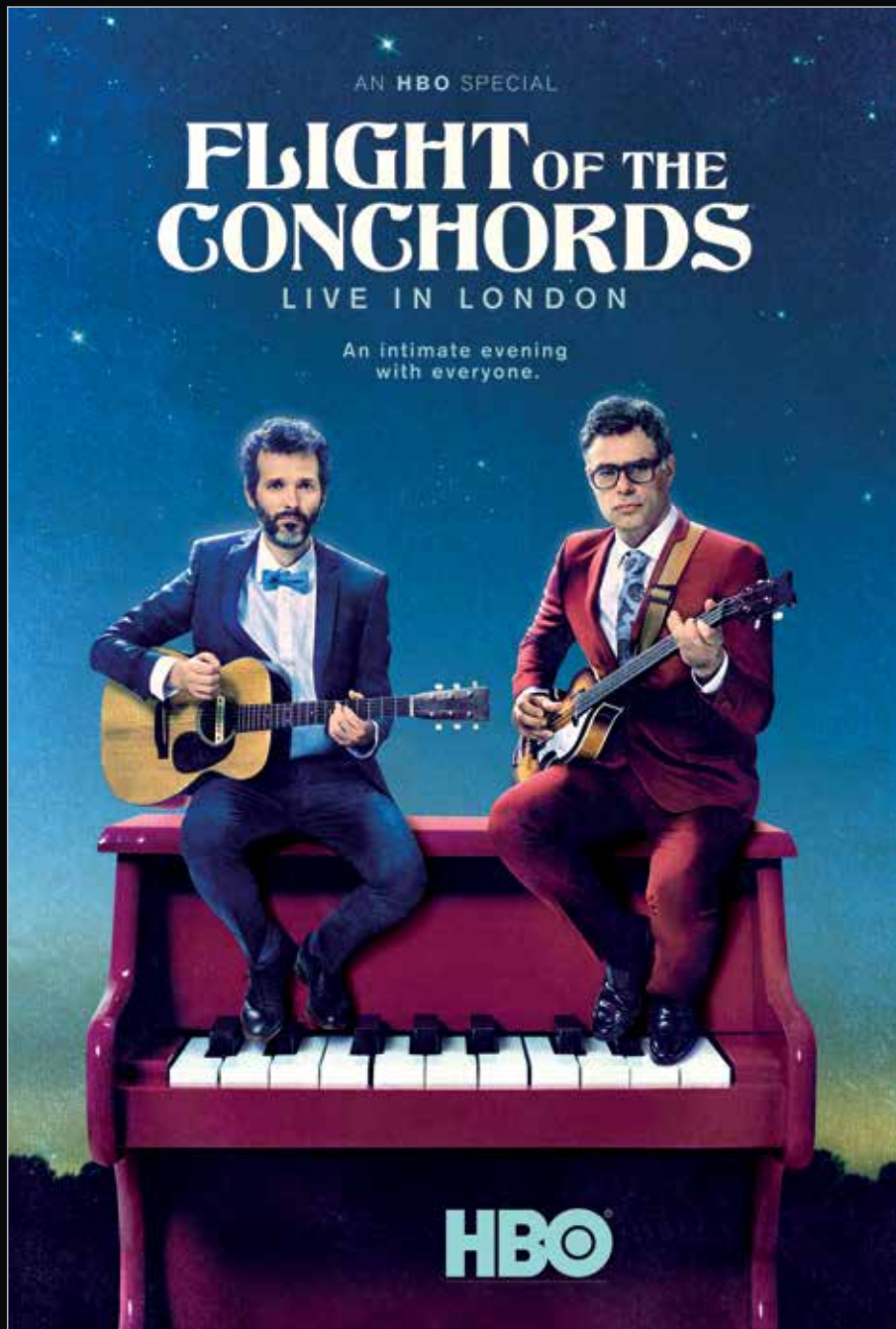
A 2018 Tribeca Film Festival selection, this feature documentary looks back at a group of surfers, many of whom were from broken or troubled homes, who were welcomed into a single house on the North Shore of Hawaii in the late 1980s – a bonding experiment that changed their outlook, their approach to surfing, and the public's perception of the sport. In addition to behind-the-scenes footage and photos taken of and by the group, *Momentum Generation* includes recent interviews with surviving members, as well as clips from several groundbreaking movies by Taylor Steele, who fused punk music with surf footage, and turned himself and his friends into celebrities. As we learn, the rise to '90s fame of the *Momentum Generation* surfers, coupled with their increasingly lucrative careers as sponsored professionals competing around the world, tested the bonds forged in Oahu, epitomized by a single surf mentor: Todd Chesser, who made sure the group stayed true to the fun, laid-back surf credo they created and cherished. Today, 30 years after meeting, the surfers share their collective and individual stories in this intimate, exhilarating and, at times, heartbreaking film.



THE TRUTH ABOUT KILLER ROBOTS

When a robot kills a human, who takes the blame? *The Truth About Killer Robots* explores this question, as well as many other practical and ethical matters that humans face as we become more dependent on robots than ever before. An eerie, eye-opening work of science nonfiction, this 83-minute documentary from director Maxim Pozdorovkin (*Pussy Riot: A Punk Prayer*) charts incidents in which robots caused the deaths of humans – in an automated Volkswagen factory, in a self-driving Tesla vehicle, and by a bomb-carrying droid used by Dallas police – considering the issues that these cases, typically treated as freak anomalies, raise in terms of accountability and morality. Highlighting the provocative views of engineers, journalists and philosophers, and narrated by a lifelike Japanese android Kodomoroid, *The Truth About Killer Robots* goes beyond the sensational deaths to examine more subtle but pervasive ways that robots pose a threat to society, challenging us to question what a future living amongst these non-human entities could mean for humankind as we know it.

Robert demonstrates a curiosity, deep knowledge and expertise for all the animals around him, as well as an infectious enthusiasm to share this experience with others, a memorable trait often showcased by his father. In the season premiere, Robert, after months of croc wrangling training with Steve Irwin's best friend Wes, takes the final step in his journey to feed Graham, a huge crocodile at the zoo's famous Crocoseum. Originally rescued by Steve, Graham is the Zoo's largest and most volatile big croc, with a history of dragging Steve Irwin into the water during a routine capture, and separately injuring Wes with a surprise death roll that left him hospitalized. Bindi helps tend to Cedar, a rescue koala that has given birth to a rare set of twin joeys who must now survive the 6 to 8-month period before they can leave Cedar's pouch. Bindi and the zookeepers face ongoing challenges to keep the twin joeys alive as nature and survival of the fittest comes into play as one of the rarest types of koala pregnancies leaves the two joeys struggling and fighting for life.
