Exploring Civil Rights with

JUST MERCY

SYNOPSIS:

A powerful true story, "Just Mercy" follows young lawyer Bryan Stevenson (Jordan) and his history-making battle for justice. After graduating from Harvard, Bryan had his pick of lucrative jobs. Instead, he heads to Alabama to defend those wrongly condemned or who were not afforded proper representation, with the support of local advocate Eva Ansley (Larson). One of his first, and most incendiary, cases is that of Walter McMillian (Foxx), who, in 1987, was sentenced to die for the murder of an 18-year-old girl, despite a preponderance of evidence proving his innocence and the fact that the only testimony against him came from a criminal with a motive to lie.

GRADE LEVEL: High School (9th–12th grade)

CIVIL RIGHTS:

After viewing the film, lead a class discussion or assign an essay about the following topics:

• Racial Integration and Discrimination:

Engage students in a conversation about the film's portrayal of racial discrimination and the systemic challenges faced by the characters. Discuss how "Just Mercy" highlights the ongoing struggle for racial justice, comparing it to the historical context of the Civil Rights Movement.

• Unity and Teamwork:

Discuss the use of teamwork in the film and how it was essential in overcoming prejudices. Analyze the collaboration between Bryan Stevenson, his colleagues, and the community in supporting Walter McMillian. Encourage students to think critically about the importance of unity and teamwork both during the Civil Rights Movement and in present-day efforts to combat social injustices.





SYNOPSIS:

Undocumented Mexican-American high-school students in Arizona form a robotics club, and take on MIT in the National Underwater Robotics Competition with the help of a teacher.

GRADE LEVEL: Middle School (6th–8th grade)

TECHNOLOGY & MATH:

After viewing the film, lead a class discussion about the following topics:

• Engineering Design Process:

Explore the steps the students in the film took to design and build their underwater robot. Highlight the importance of brainstorming, prototyping, testing and iteration.

• Problem-Solving Skills:

Discuss how the characters used problem-solving skills to overcome technical challenges. Encourage students to think about a time they had to solve a difficult problem using technology or math.





Ask students to create a vision board for their future goals, including the steps they can take to achieve them.



Explore the importance of imagination and creativity as highlighted in the film. Discuss how creativity can lead to innovation and the importance of fostering a creative mindset.

According to copyright law, movies may be shown in a classroom without a license only if all criteria of the "face-to-face" teaching exemption are met. If they don't meet that criteria, then a public performance license is required.
